Michael Ellis RN passed away on June 2nd 2002 after 32 years in the Royal Navy. He joined at 17 in 1953 the year after the 'Spithead Review' when around 190 ships were 'reviewed' by the new Queen Elizabeth, in the 1977 'review' around 125 were gathered, this year for the golden jubilee I believe 5 were present. Whatever happened to the Royal Navy in 50 years.
